EXECUTIVE TEACHER'S MESSAGE

Welcome to Week 8 Term 3! Recently we were very lucky to host the Belconnen Director of School Improvement, Kris Willis and Principal of Kaleen Primary School, Chris Shaddock for a **school improvement focus visit**. This visit was an important 'check in' to see how we are progressing the priorities of our strategic plan. We were able to nominate a focus for the two-hour visit, we chose Cultural Integrity. The leadership team met with Kris and Chris to talk about how we are strengthening a positive school culture and community connectedness, which is Strategic Priority 3 in our School Plan. We discussed our assessment on the Cultural Integrity Continuum, highlighting our recent achievements including high quality professional learning for all staff, every teacher participating in an action learning project within their teaching teams, every student writing their own acknowledgement of country, and a whole school commitment to teaching *through* culture not *about* culture. The 'VIPs' then conducted a Learning Walk across the school to gauge student's knowledge, understandings and feelings about the work and learning that has been completed so far. Whilst we await formal written feedback from our guests, their initial feedback was very positive and encouraging.

On Thursday 19 September you are invited to your child's classroom for their **Learning Journey**. Classrooms will be open from 3:15-6pm explore the learning that has taken place so far this year. The aim of the afternoon is to give you a real-life snapshot of day to day learning and tasks which take place in addition to what you have seen so far this term on Seesaw. 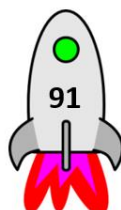

NEWS FROM YEAR 5

Here we are nearly at the end of Term 3. Year 5 have been extremely busy undertaking lots of inquiry-based learning in Geography as well as participating in several extra curricula activities such as Limelight and Softball Clinics.

Geography

This term, Year 5 students have been researching different countries from around the world. Students chose a country of interest and researched popular landmarks/tourist attractions, climate, traditional clothing, currency, languages spoken, and food and transport to name a few. The students have created Google Slides and posters to present their information. The finished products will be showcased during our upcoming Learning Journeys in Week 9.



Book Club

Students in Year 5 have been participating in 3-4 person Book Clubs. The group chooses a narrative that they are all interested in, and as they are reading, they discuss and record information about the character, plot and setting. These group reading sessions provide a daily opportunity for students to both read aloud and listen to

reading. Tricky and interesting words can be discussed, and predictions can be made about what will happen next in the story.

SEL – Yoga with Michelle Langshaw

Year 5 have been fortunate to have been selected to participate in a Yoga program lead by Michelle Langshaw. Each week the students undertake Mindfulness activities, yoga postures and stretching. Michelle has also created a workbook with follow-up activities which allow the students to express their thoughts, feelings and reflections on the lesson's focus. It has been wonderful observing the increased focus and application of the students during these sessions, hopefully many will use these skills and apply them in the future.



Cultural Integrity – Action Research

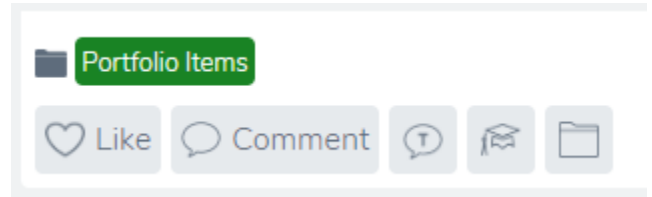
Currently we are highlighting one of the pedagogies each week with activities which promote a particular way of learning in Science. Once the unit is completed, we will survey the students to discover if they have a preferred style of learning and we will use this information for future planning.

This year the staff of Giralang Primary have undertaken action research in the area of Cultural Integrity. In Year 5 we have focused on whether our teaching programs reflect Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander perspectives. Our particular area of research was to apply Dr Tyson Yunkaporta's 8 Ways of Learning to our Term 3 Science unit, *Earth's Place in Space*.

One of Diane's key approaches to her teaching is recognising and responding to unique student needs. Instead of following just one inflexible teaching style, she prioritises developing goals with the student and then creates a plan for the student to achieve their goals.



Trophies are also presented for Rating Groups and unrated players.
