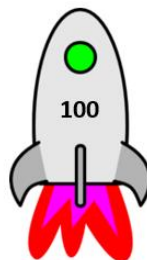
Book Packs will be delivered to school in late January 2020 and distributed to your child's classroom, ready for the new school year.

NEWS FROM YEAR 1

Year 1 has had an exciting start to Term 4! We welcomed Elise Wark and Mitchell Parker into the team as Leanne left to deliver baby number 4. Congratulations to Leanne and Ben, on the safe arrival of baby boy, Ashby Mathew.



As you can see from this photo, we have certainly been enjoying each other's company as well as the change in the seasons when we go out to play. Our Inquiry unit this term is about change over time, so we've been thinking about the seasons and other ways that we can see time changing.



Year 1 were lucky enough to experience the 'Then and Now,' unit at the National Museum of Australia this term. The students have been exploring the past and investigating the differences between the past and the present. The museum was a great opportunity for the students to put hands-on authentic, historical artefacts used in all sorts of rooms in the house, such as kitchens, garages, toy rooms, dressing rooms as well as odd pieces of technology such as a phone that you dialled by sticking your finger in a hole and turning!

We saw and discussed multipurpose artefacts used by some Aboriginal Australians. Later, we explored one of the galleries that showed us artefacts that 20th century Australians used to travel around and complete day to day chores. A great big thank you to those parents who were able to support us with this excursion.

The students have also been investigating the history of their own families, through sharing photos of themselves from the past, creating family trees and interviewing their Grandfriend's about their own experiences as children. Thank you, families, for all your support in helping the students organise items and information to share about their and their family's pasts. Students are loving immersing themselves in rich and interesting history.

Ms Floyd has organised a chat box of artefacts from the Canberra Museum and Art Gallery for us to explore in class as well. We have been learning about a great many interesting things from history.

The writing focus for Year 1 this term has been 'narratives'. This is a great opportunity for the students to really demonstrate their creativity and imagination. Students have been learning about character, setting, problems and solutions, to structure their narrative writing. They have been exploring descriptive language to help make their writing engaging and are enjoying sharing their writing with others.

For Maths this term, not only have we been looking at time, but we have also been looking at Australian coins. After learning to recognise coins and describe their features, we began to learn about their value. Students practiced converting cents to dollars and combining a range of coins to create a certain value.

We look forward to spending the last weeks of 2019 with our talented, kind and caring classes. We are some very lucky teachers!

PRIVATE MUSIC LESSONS

DIANE LONDON – PIANO

Diane London has played piano since childhood and instantly developed a love for music, it is this enjoyment and appreciation that she has been passing on to others as a piano teacher for over 15 years in Canberra. Diane's training has included university study (BMUS) at the Canberra School of Music (Australian National University) as well as a Bachelor of Actuarial Studies from the Australian National University. Diane teaches from ages 4 years and upwards and also teaches many adult students at her Lyneham studio.

As part of her studies at the Canberra School of Music, Diane has been taught by some of Australia's most talented musicians, including Professor Larry Sitsky who is a prolific Australian composer, pianist, researcher and who is one of the founding members of the Canberra School of Music (ANU) and John Luxton (former head director of the Canberra School of Music (ANU)). Diane has also been taught by Wendy Lorenz, making her a 6th generation descendant student of Ludwig Van Beethoven, the lineage is - Diane London - Wendy Lorenz - Maria Curcio - Artur Schnabel - Theodor Leschetizky - Carl Czerny - Ludwig van Beethoven.

As a pianist, Diane has performed many times at the Canberra School of Music as well as performances across Canberra including the Australian Parliament House and Wesley Music Centre. Diane has also adjudicated piano competitions such as the Miles Franklin Music Festival Piano Competition.

One of Diane's key approaches to her teaching is recognising and responding to unique student needs. Instead of following just one inflexible teaching style, she prioritises developing goals with the student and then creates a plan for the student to achieve their goals.

Student goals can vary widely and can include just wanting learn to play the piano for fun, preparing for AMEB piano practical exams, learning piano to 'keep the brain active', or even learning music theory, history and composition. Diane has helped hundreds of students successfully achieve their musical goals.
