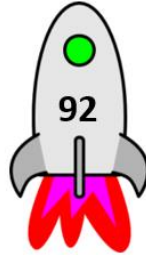

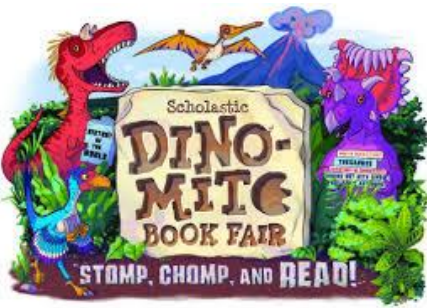

NEWS FROM PRESCHOOL

We had a wonderful time investigating the Nolan collection at the Canberra Museum and Gallery earlier this term. The program we participated in was called 'Every Picture tells a Story'. The preschool children were able to engage with selected works from Nolan's 'Ned Kelly' series of paintings and bring them to life through art-based games, singing, storytelling, puppetry and role playing. Children further investigated these ideas during a practical art making session in the CMAG studio where each child had the opportunity to experiment with a variety of media to create their very own art works.

Here are some photos capturing our creative learning experience...



Our literacy learning has been focusing on developing children's oral language. To support the children's learning we have been reading quality early childhood literature with a focus on rhyme. The children will continue to write their own names often, to support their pre-writing skills. Each child is encouraged to write their name on the sign-in roll every day, and we will continue to explore letter-sound relationships through songs and word explorations through literature.

Numeracy learning opportunities are embedded throughout the preschool program. This term we have been using games, manipulatives, songs, chants and rhymes to provide children with opportunities to learn about repeated patterns, measurement, counting using one to one correspondence, and subitising. Counting using one to one correspondence is when children are able to count objects and assign a number to each individual item. Subitising is the process of immediately recognising how many items are in a small group without counting. During group time we have been using the class calendar to learn about the date, month and days of the week and together count the number of children in attendance each day.

Please be aware that it is 'hats on' policy and to ensure to provide your child with a hat each day. We have spare sunscreen near the sign in sheets, for you to apply to your child upon arrival.

We look forward to Term 4! We value your feedback and contributions. Please feel free to add any comments, suggestion or ideas to our SeeSaw community.

PRIVATE MUSIC LESSONS

DIANE LONDON – PIANO

Diane London has played piano since childhood and instantly developed a love for music, it is this enjoyment and appreciation that she has been passing on to others as a piano teacher for over 15 years in Canberra. Diane's training has included university study (BMUS) at the Canberra School of Music (Australian National University) as well as a Bachelor of Actuarial Studies from the Australian National University. Diane teaches from ages 4 years and upwards and also teaches many adult students at her Lyneham studio.

As part of her studies at the Canberra School of Music, Diane has been taught by some of Australia's most talented musicians, including Professor Larry Sitsky who is a prolific Australian composer, pianist, researcher and who is one of the founding members of the Canberra School of Music (ANU) and John Luxton (former head director of the Canberra School of Music (ANU)). Diane has also been taught by Wendy Lorenz, making her a 6th generation descendant student of Ludwig Van Beethoven, the lineage is - Diane London - Wendy Lorenz - Maria Curcio - Artur Schnabel - Theodor Leschetizky - Carl Czerny - Ludwig van Beethoven.

As a pianist, Diane has performed many times at the Canberra School of Music as well as performances across Canberra including the Australian Parliament House and Wesley Music Centre. Diane has also adjudicated piano competitions such as the Miles Franklin Music Festival Piano Competition.

One of Diane's key approaches to her teaching is recognising and responding to unique student needs. Instead of following just one inflexible teaching style, she prioritises developing goals with the student and then creates a plan for the student to achieve their goals.

Student goals can vary widely and can include just wanting learn to play the piano for fun, preparing for AMEB piano practical exams, learning piano to 'keep the brain active', or even learning music theory, history and composition. Diane has helped hundreds of students successfully achieve their musical goals.
