NEWS FROM THE LIBRARY – OVERDUE POLICY

With the support of the school community Giralang Primary has a well-resourced library, providing the students with the opportunity to discover the enjoyment of reading. We appreciate the support the library receives from our families and in the endeavour to keep these resources available to all, our overdue policy has been reviewed:

1. As students are borrowing books, they are reminded of any overdue items. They are encouraged to find and return the books;
2. In week 5, a class list of overdue books will be sent to the class teachers as a reminder for those who have not returned their overdue books ;
3. In week 9 of term, an email will be sent to families of students with overdue books. This email will include book/s details and replacement cost; and
4. In term 4 the return of all borrowed books will enable a smooth running of stocktake. There will be extra reminders, to return overdue books in this term.

It would be appreciated if overdue books be returned as soon as possible. If they are lost, a reimbursement would help replace missing items.



The first is the Eco Warriors design project, which is hoping to reduce single-use plastic within our school community by creating custom design reusable shopping bags and cups, especially with Plastic Free July coming up. With this in mind, our next project is to ensure EVERY student at Giralang has a beeswax wrap to use in their lunch box. A beeswax wrap is a multipurpose food wrap that keeps food fresh longer without using plastic wrap. They ensure your food is keeping its freshness without costing the Earth.

Some alternatives to use in your lunch box to reduce your single-use plastic waste include:

1. Reusable drink bottle
2. Beeswax wraps instead of plastic wrap products
3. Buying in bulk and using containers
4. Pack cutlery from home to reduce plastic cutlery


