JAMES STEINBECK – GUITAR AND ELECTRIC BASS GUITAR

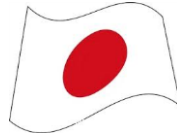

It has been an exciting and productive first semester in Japanese. In term 2 we welcomed our new Japanese assistant, Yuina Hirata, from Kagoshima University. Yuina has been working with all classes and has been a fantastic help and resource for both the students and myself. Having a Japanese assistant is a relatively new program at Giralang primary which started last year with our first assistant, Megumi. The program is an extremely valuable and beneficial part of our Japanese learning and is only possible through the help of our school community offering homestay accommodation. Many thanks to the Grudnoff, Fitzpatrick and Harrild families for hosting Yuina this year. Your hospitality is greatly appreciated.

We are also lucky to again have Rowelanne Stubbs volunteering in our Wednesday classes as well as taking two of the Preschool classes each week. Yuina has been joining Rowelanne in the preschool on a Wednesday as well. Row's knowledge of the Japanese language is excellent and her experience of living in Japan offers the students the opportunity to ask many questions. The students have very much enjoyed their classes with both Yuina-sensei and Rowelanne-sensei, and I have been very pleased with the progress in all classes.



Kindergarten have shown much enthusiasm learning to read and write numbers in Kanji, while Years 1 and 2 have been learning how to describe the weather in different cities in Australia and Japan. The students have retained the weather vocabulary very well and are ready to report!



Years 3 and 4 have been learning how to identify a variety of sports in Japanese and are able to say what sports they do or don't play. They have also learnt how to write these sentences in the past tense.

Years 5 and 6 have working on giving and following directions off a map. Students are able to give basic instructions on how to get from one place to another. They also learnt how to write some of the more common words in Kanji and are slowly starting to recognise them without assistance.

I would like to thank all students for their continued effort and enthusiasm in Japanese and I look forward to lots more learning and fun next term.
