## NEWS FROM 4B – DYURRA & 4G - DHURRAWAN

This term Year 4 has been learning about earth and space sciences, with the assistance of Mark Alliston and Tim Jones from the Academy of Future Skills. The students have been discussing ways in which the Earth's surface can change over time as a result of natural activity such as weathering and erosion. With the help of microscopes, each class investigated various soil samples from the South Coast, using their acquired knowledge to identify where each sample may have come from. Year 4 students recently went on an excursion to the Giralang Wetlands where they observed and recorded cross-sections of multiple dig sites. It was fantastic to see everyone working together and having in-depth discussions about what they saw. We are very grateful that Mark and Tim could lend their scientific expertise and resources to help us successfully investigate and appreciate what is beneath our feet!

For those parents who care as much as we do about the ingredients we use in our nude food dishes, please see our ingredient list for our end of term nude food day:

**Sweet & salty popcorn:** corn kernels (air popped), maple syrup and pink Himalayan rock salt.

**Yogurt & berry coulis:** plain greek yoghurt, fresh strawberries, raspberries, blueberries, black berries, coconut sugar, vanilla (note: frozen berries will substitute if fresh cannot be sourced).

**Chicken schnitzel burger with smashed avo & baby spinach:** chicken thighs, egg wash, plain flour, fresh homemade herbed breadcrumbs, avocado, fresh garlic, salt and pepper, baby spinach, burger roll.

**Pulled pork burger & apple slaw:** pork shoulder, red onion, fresh garlic, apple cider vinegar, maple syrup, smoked paprika, salt and pepper, burger roll **Slaw:** white and red cabbage, carrot, apple, greek yoghurt, mild mustard, lemon juice, salt and pepper.

Please note any reference to salt and pepper means black pepper and pink himalayan rock salt. All bread rolls are sourced locally from the Kaleen Family Bakery which uses traditional bread ingredients which are free from vegetable oils, additives and preservatives. As per normal, gluten, dairy and egg free can be arranged.

## PRIVATE MUSIC LESSONS – DIANE LONDON – PIANO

Diane London has played piano since childhood and instantly developed a love for music, it is this enjoyment and appreciation that she has been passing on to others as a piano teacher for over 15 years in Canberra. Diane's training has included university study (BMUS) at the Canberra School of Music (Australian National University) as well as a Bachelor of Actuarial Studies from the Australian National University. Diane teaches from ages 4 years and upwards and teaches many adult students at her Lyneham studio.

As part of her studies at the Canberra School of Music, Diane has been taught by some of Australia's most talented musicians, including Professor Larry Sitsky who is a prolific Australian composer, pianist, researcher and who is one of the founding members of the Canberra School of Music (ANU) and John Luxton (former head director of the Canberra School of Music (ANU)). Diane has also been taught by Wendy Lorenz, making her a 6th generation descendant student of Ludwig Van Beethoven, the lineage is - Diane London - Wendy Lorenz - Maria Curcio - Artur Schnabel - Theodor Leschetizky - Carl Czerny - Ludwig van Beethoven.

As a pianist, Diane has performed many times at the Canberra School of Music as well as performances across Canberra including the Australian Parliament House and Wesley Music Centre. Diane has also adjudicated piano competitions such as the Miles Franklin Music Festival Piano Competition.

One of Diane's key approaches to her teaching is recognising and responding to unique student needs. Instead of following just one inflexible teaching style, she prioritises developing goals with the student and then creates a plan for the student to achieve their goals.

Student goals can vary widely and can include just wanting to learn to play the piano for fun, preparing for AMEB piano practical exams, learning piano to 'keep the brain active', or even learning music theory, history and composition. Diane has helped hundreds of students successfully achieve their musical goals.





The ACT Junior Championship is our major junior chess tournament of the year. It is a three-day (FIDE and ACF) rated tournament, played with long time controls and players are expected to record moves. Perpetual trophies are awarded to the ACT Junior Champion & Junior Girls Champion as well as the Under 12 Champion & Under 12 Girls Champion. Trophies are also presented for Rating Groups and unrated players.

- When:** **Wednesday 7th – Friday 9th October.** Wed registration is from 8.45am and Play commences by 9.30am. Thursday and Friday play will start at 9.15am. Players may request any number of byes before the commencement of play. Byes will not be granted in the final round. **Presentation at roughly 4:45pm, Fri 9<sup>th</sup> Oct.** Because of the time controls involved, exact start times for each round, and our finish time each day, are not fixed. Most players will be finished about 4:30pm each day but we will be there till 5pm.
- Where:** ACT Junior Chess Centre, **Campbell High School Library**, Treloar Cres, Campbell.
- Who:** Open to all boys and girls born on or after 1 January 2000.
- Cost:** \$80-00 per player (\$90-00 if not a current ACTJCL member). Third and subsequent child from one family are free. And a \$10 discount applies to FIDE rated players
